The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to recess of the February 10, 2020 with Ken Miner, Rick Snyder and Brett Barsalou present. The minutes of the meeting of February 10, 2020 were approved.

IN THE MATTER OF STEELE MEMORIAL MEMOUANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Steele Memorial Medical Center requested a new MOU with the county for drug testing. The \$10.00 fee the county was paying was not covering the cost of testing. They requested an increase to \$25.00 per screening. Brett made motion to approve the increase and Rick Snyder seconded. All were in favor.

IN THE MATTER OF DEPARTMENT HEADS

County Agent Shannon Williams ask if the board had decided if she could move her office across the hall. They had not decided and would get back with her. Building Department Supervisor Teresa Morton told the board that Building Inspector Chris Horton had received his mechanical certification and would be working on getting his commercial certification. Landfill Supervisor Scott Duncan reported the oil burner had gone out over the three coldest days we have had. He has been researching the cost of replacing the old oil burner. He was looking into two smaller propane heaters so if one went down, they would have the other one as a backup to keep the building from freezing up. County Clerk Brenda Armstrong inquired about selling the Ford Explorer the Assessor's Office has that is not being used. The board agreed to a sealed bid process. Commissioner Barsalou suggested checking with EMS that they have an ambulance to sell. Brenda had been told the Snowmobile Club has an old groomer, a pickup and a trailer for sale. She will check with all department and get the surplus property advertised.

IN THE MATTER OF VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

Chairman Miner presented Paul Palmer with the Volunteer of the Year Award. He was nominated by the Lemhi County Emergency Medical Services.

IN THE MATTER OF SALMON VALLEY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

Lauren Zarske, SVCC Director gave the board an update on future plans. She told them they have a new website with their yearly calendar. Have been doing monthly networking and newsletters. They have a mock grant they will be using for sign boards. They plan on applying for grants to help with future events. In March they will be having board elections to fill four vacate seats. IN THE MATTER OF SCASD GRANT FINALIZATION

Jo Schroeder from Gem Air presented the final report to the board. This is a report that the Department of Transportation requires before the final payment can be requested. She gave an overview of some of the questions in the questionnaire. Gem Air had sent out a questionnaire to help answer some of the questions. Commissioner Miner ask who the questionnaire had been sent to. They had sent it to the clients that had used the air service. 135 had responded out of the 400 surveys sent out.

Brett Barsalou moved, and Rick Snyder seconded to go into executive session pursuant to Idaho Code 74-206(b) personnel issues were discussed and pursuant to Idaho Code 74-206(d) to hear indigent matters.
