Salmon, Idaho

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session pursuant to recess of the March 15, 2021 with Brett Barsalou Chairman, Richard Snyder and Leah Madsen present. The minutes of the meeting of March 8, 2021 and March 15, 2021 were approved.

IN THE MATTER OF DEPARTMENT HEADS

Rob Schick Airport Board Chairman ask the board for their signature giving him authorization to the Delphi account so that he would be able to request grant payments on behalf of the airport. Weed Supervisor Sharayh Krantz presented the Boat Check Station Agreement for the boards signature. She let them know she was working on getting the spray truck ready for the season. Russ Dalley Building Maintenance Supervisor reported that he was getting the winter cleanup done. The plumbing issue in the Probation office has been repaired and h will be contact Wellard Construction on the start date of the courthouse step replacement. Probation Officer Tom Fitte presented the board with a thank you card from the IDFY for the projector screen. He will be working on a survey to send out to parents to get them more involved with the Leap Project. Tom presented the Annual Youth Report and the probation checks have been going well. Landfill Supervisor Scott Duncan reported he has received three bids for the recycling to be done. His new hire started last week and things are going well. EMS Coordinator Treva Wing reported they were going to be meeting with the state on our ambulance licensing.

IN THE MATTER OF ALL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

EMS Coordinator Treva Wing presented the All-Hazard Mitigation Plan to the board for adoption. Rick Snyder moved and Leah Madsen seconded. All were in favor.

IN THE MATTER OF PROJECT MINERALS

Tammy Stringham Economic Development Director presented information process for the county to be able to give tax incentives. Here would need to be an ordinance adopted and then a resolution. They would be able to set their own minimum investment amount to receive a break. The county would be able to set their own parameters.

IN THE MATTER OF RECYCLING BID OPENING

There were three bids received. Over all estimated totals were Western Metals Recycling \$37,600.00, Millcreek Metals \$33,813.00 and Pacific Recycling \$17,140.00. The actual scrap per ton estimates were Millcreek Metals \$123, Western Metals Recycling \$100 and Pacific Recycling \$90. Rick Snyder made motion to except Millcreek Metals bid and Leah Madsen seconded. All were in favor of accepting this bid after Landfill Supervisor Scott Duncan has an opportunity to review all bids.

IN THE MATTER OF FISCAL YEAR 2020 AUDIT

Farrell Steiner of Searle, Hart and Associates presented the fiscal year 2020 audit of Lemhi County and said that there were no issues of concern. A copy of the audit can be seen in the Clerk's office or on the county website at www.lemhicountyidaho.org.

IN THE MATTER OF DRUG COURT UPDATE

Judge Andrew Woolf, Coordinator Jana Eagle and Lemhi Valley Social Services Annie Stokes wanted to reported to the board some of the positive things that Drug Court is doing. They have a recovery group that is mentoring other participates. The success rate after graduation from problem solving court is around 67%. The cost to tax payers for housing an offender at IDOC is over \$27,000 per year, local jail is \$9,000 a year and to treat a drug court participant using Supreme Court funding can cost up to \$5,000. Commissioner Barsalou ask if the state had ever had a press release that could be released to the public explaining how the Drug Court Program works. They felt that was a great idea and would check statewide to see if anything was available. If not, they would work on this to get it out to the public. Annie explained that most times it does take 2-5 treatments to have a life changing result but the cost is still much lower than jail or IDOC.

Rick Snyder moved and Leah Madsen seconded to go into executive session pursuant to Idaho Code 74-206 (b) for evaluation matters. Roll call vote was held. Snyder - AYE: Madsen – AYE: Barsalou – AYE.

After convening in regular session, there was no further business, the board adjourn until Monday April 12, 2021 @ 7:30 a.m.
